2 MR. MARTIN: Good afternoon. This is Monday,
3 August 14th, 2023, a little after noon. And this is a called
4 meeting of the city of Franklin Ethics Commission, I'm Jim
5 Martin, Vona Wilson is here to my left -- excuse me, she's to
6 my right and Jerry Sharber is to my left. And I understand
7 that Ms. Thompson is not going to be able to join us today;
8 is that correct? But we do have a quorum and based upon that
9 quorum, we will proceed. Last week I was furnished a draft
10 of an agenda for today, which included approval of the
11 minutes of the meeting of July 27th, 2023.

12 Ms. Wilson, have you had a chance to review the
13 minutes?

14 MS. WILSON: Yes.

15 MR. MARTIN: Do you have any changes, corrections,
16 additions or deletions?

17 MS. WILSON: I do not.

18 MR. MARTIN: Mr. Sharber, have you had a chance to
19 review the minutes?

20 MR. SHARBER: I have.

21 MR. MARTIN: Very well. Do I have a motion to
22 approve the minutes?

23 MR. SHARBER: So moved.

24 MS. WILSON: I second.

25 MR. MARTIN: Motion has been made and a second to

1 approve the minutes of July 27th 2023; all in favor say aye.

2 MS. WILSON: Aye.

3 MR. SHARBER: Aye.

4 MR. MARTIN: Aye. Very good.

5 We also had an executive meeting that morning. Do
6 we have minutes of that executive session? We do not.

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Well, the 8:00 a.m. one,
8 just the special minutes were also attached. So the motion
9 -- the motion that you just made covered both sets of
10 minutes.

11 MR. MARTIN: They covered both.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Uh-huh, yes, sir.

13 MR. MARTIN: Both the 8:00 a.m. session and the
14 noon session.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes, sir. Yes.

16 MR. MARTIN: All right. Very good.

17 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Yes, I apologize.

18 MR. MARTIN: In addition, I was furnished the
19 transcript of the proceedings on July 27th, 2023. Ms.
20 Wilson, did you also receive a copy of the transcript?

21 MS. WILSON: I did.

22 MR. MARTIN: And Mr. Sharber, did you receive a
23 copy of the transcript?

24 MR. SHARBER: I did.

25 MR. MARTIN: Very good. Our counsel, Ms. Ashworth,

1 drafted a proposed written decision that was part of the
2 papers that I was furnished last week. And Ms. Wilson, did
3 you also receive after draft of a written decision that was
4 prepared on our behalf by Ms. Gail Vaughn Ashworth?

5 MS. WILSON: Yes, I did.

6 MR. MARTIN: Mr. Sharber, did you receive it as
7 well?

8 MR. SHARBER: I did.

9 MR. MARTIN: Very good.

10 Mr. Horwitz, did you have a chance to look at the
11 transcript and/or the written decision that's been drafted
12 for our consideration?

13 MR. HORWITZ: I did not receive it, but I have it.
14 I found it on the notice.

15 MR. MARTIN: Okay. Very good.

16 MR. HORWITZ: I do have -- I don't want to
17 interrupt this -- the proceedings, but I do have two matters
18 regarding it that I would like to be heard on at some point,
19 but I would let the --

20 MR. MARTIN: That's fine. If you don't mind, I am
21 hard of hearing, so you will need to elevate your voice.

22 MR. HORWITZ: I apologize. Is this working this
23 time?

24 MR. MARTIN: Yeah, now, that works fine. Thank
25 you.

1 MR. HORWITZ: I'll get closer.

2 MR. MARTIN: Very good.

3 So Ms. Wilson, did you have a chance to study the
4 draft that was presented for our considered and do you have
5 any changes, corrections, additions or deletions that you
6 would care to offer?

7 MS. WILSON: I did review it and I don't have any
8 changes, or additions or deletions.

9 MR. MARTIN: All right. Mr. Sharber?

10 MR. SHARBER: I did receive it. I reviewed it, and
11 I have one, I'm going to call it a suggestion.

12 MR. MARTIN: Okay.

13 MR. SHARBER: It does not have -- I'm not totally
14 firm on having this, but in the findings of fact under
15 section one, Alderman Gabrielle Hanson is a duly elected city
16 official for the City of Franklin.

17 MR. MARTIN: Uh-huh.

18 MR. SHARBER: My suggestion and/or question is:
19 Should we include in there the date that she was elected and
20 the date that she was sworn in?

21 MR. MARTIN: Well, we don't have that in the
22 evidence, so it would be hard for us to make that finding.

23 MR. SHARBER: Okay. I mean, that's public record.

24 MR. MARTIN: Yeah, but there's a whole lot of the
25 stuff that's out there.

1 MR. SHARBER: Yeah, that's true.

2 MR. MARTIN: You know, unless it was evidence
3 presented to us during the course of the proceeding, I don't
4 think it should be in our --

5 MR. SHARBER: And it was not.

6 MR. MARTIN: And It was not.

7 Mr. Horwitz, yeah, that's fine. You wanted to
8 address commission?

9 MR. HORWITZ: Yes. Regarding two matters. The
10 first and most important one is the last page before the
11 transcript, the judicial review component.

12 MR. MARTIN: Yes. And this is the page entitled,
13 "Recommendation"?

14 MR. HORWITZ: No, it's the page entitled, "Judicial
15 Review".

16 MR. SHARBER: Judicial review.

17 MR. HORWITZ: It should be the last page.

18 MR. MARTIN: Oh, okay. Yes.

19 MR. HORWITZ: I want to make sure everybody is on
20 the same page here. So that first subsection, Number 1,
21 provides that an appeal may be filed within 30-days, I think
22 everyone is in agreement that that is correct.

23 The second portion, I am just going to read it.
24 "Upon failure to timely request judicial review of the
25 decision by writ of certiorari, as provided in the section,

1 the decision shall be binding on final upon all parties".

2 Now, I understand from this -- this provision from
3 the rules, that the decision is not binding until the appeal
4 process has either concluded or an appeal has not been taken.
5 And the reason I emphasize this is because the City's
6 attorneys have already approached the Board of Aldermen
7 before this body has even approved this finding last week,
8 before the appeal process has even begun to try to present
9 findings.

10 Now, I thought we were clear about the fact we do
11 intend to appeal. And I want to make sure everyone here is
12 clear. There is an appellate process that ought to be
13 respected. The decision is not binding and final until that
14 process has concluded.

15 So to the extent that there was any doubt, we
16 intend to file a petition for writ of certiorari, exercise
17 appellate rights. And my ask would be that everybody respect
18 the process -- the due process that is part of this order, as
19 part of the municipal code and that the City's counsel not
20 rush to the Board of Alderman to present findings before that
21 process is complete.

22 MR. MARTIN: Well, help me understand your concern.
23 Paragraph one, says that you have 30 days to petition for a
24 writ of certiorari, paragraph two says if you don't do
25 that, then the decision of the commission becomes final. I'm

1 not clear what your concern is.

2 MR. HORWITZ: After we take this appeal, which we
3 intend to do, while the appellate process is underway, the
4 City's attorneys are going to approach the Board of Aldermen
5 and present this body's decision as if it were final and
6 binding when it is not yet final and binding and ask the
7 Board of Alderman to act based on a none final, not yet
8 binding and ask the Board of Alderman to act based on a
9 nonfinal, not yet binding decision. That's my concern.

10 MR. MARTIN: Well, let me say that: While I
11 respect your concern and I'm not saying it doesn't have
12 merit, that's beyond the scope of our consideration. All
13 that we are asked to do is to submit the finding and
14 recommendation. What's done after that is beyond our
15 control.

16 MR. HORWITZ: Understood. I just want to make sure
17 because this is your action and they are your attorneys
18 that --

19 MR. MARTIN: No, our attorney is Gail Ashworth.

20 MR. HORWITZ: That's who I am referring to.

21 MR. MARTIN: Gail Vaughn Ashworth. The City of
22 Franklin is represented by separate counsel. And what the
23 City does is certainly up to the City. They will be guided
24 by their lawyer, we are guided by our counsel.

25 MR. HORWITZ: I understand that. And I'm referring

1 to Ms. Ashworth here. I want to make sure that everyone here
2 and Ms. Ashworth are in agreement that it is not this body's
3 intention for its decision to be final and binding until the
4 appellate process has been concluded.

5 MR. MARTIN: It's our intention comply with the
6 requirements of the Municipal Code as stated, and I don't
7 think it's a misstatement of that.

8 MR. HORWITZ: No, it's a correct statement.

9 MR. MARTIN: Well, that is our intention.

10 MR. HORWITZ: Okay. So next week when Ms. Ashworth
11 has planned to address the Board of Alderman to present this
12 decision as final and binding, I want to make sure that this
13 commission is not on board with that.

14 MR. MARTIN: Well, I'm not giving any opinion at
15 all. I'm telling you that this is what the Code says and our
16 responsibility is to enter an order, which we are hopefully
17 going to do.

18 What happens next week is beyond the scope of our
19 consideration.

20 MR. HORWITZ: Well, not if it's --

21 MR. MARTIN: I'm not going to give you an advisory
22 opinion on what should or shouldn't be done next week.

23 MR. HORWITZ: That I appreciate it. I want to make
24 sure that actions that are taken on this body's behalf
25 comport with what this body is intending to do, and it's my

1 understanding from this accurate statement, that we are all
2 in agreement that this decision is not binding and is not
3 final until the appellate process has been completed.

4 MR. MARTIN: We are in the agreement that this is
5 what the Manciple Code says and our responsibility is limited
6 to making now our findings, which we are going to do. We
7 understand the concern.

8 And the City Attorney is here, and I'm sure that
9 the City will take your concern into consideration. But
10 it's -- your -- your point maybe we -- it's certainly maybe
11 well taken, but its not something that we can do anything
12 about. In other words if -- if the Board of Mayor and
13 Alderman elected to act on our recommendation, your point is
14 they shouldn't do that until there has been a final review by
15 the Chancery Court of Williamson County. Well, I'm not going
16 to tell the board of Alderman what they should or shouldn't
17 do. That is completely up to the Board.

18 MR. HORWITZ: I just want to make sure that the
19 Board understands, that everybody else understands that this
20 body's recommendation is not yet final and it is not yet bind
21 ing.

22 MR. MARTIN: Well, I've heard what you've said, I
23 think that's all you can say about it. And I've said all I
24 intend to say about it. Thank you.

25 Do you have anything else you want to bring to our

1 attention?

2 MR. HORWITZ: Yes. The only other thing: I want
3 to confirm there have been no further deliberations between
4 the hearing a few weeks ago and today?

5 MR. MARTIN: Do what?

6 MR. HORWITZ: There have been no further
7 deliberations regarding this matter between July 27th and
8 today; is that correct?

9 MR. MARTIN: Well, you tell me. I'm not going to
10 testify. I will state frankly, I have not spoken to Ms.
11 Wilson until this morning when she got here and we haven't
12 talked about this case until we walked into this room. And I
13 have not spoken to Mr. Sharber and nor have I spoken to Ms.
14 Thompson. And I would assume that nobody else has talked
15 with one another either.

16 We've been instructed clearly to comply with the
17 Open Meetings Act and that --

18 MR. HORWITZ: And that's --

19 MR. MARTIN: And this commission has complied with
20 it strictly.

21 MR. HORWITZ: And that was my understanding, that
22 was my assumption. And the reason I mention it is because
23 there are -- at least from my reading of the findings of fact
24 included here and comparing them against the transcript,
25 multiple findings of fact that were inserted into this

1 proposed written decision this body did not make. So to the
2 extend that the transcript is inconsistent with findings that
3 were inserted in here by counsel, I just want to reflect that
4 there were not further deliberations undertaken between the
5 hearing and today.

6 MR. MARTIN: Well, the draft of the findings that
7 have been presented to us along with the transcript is what
8 we are to consider today. I was pretty clear, I believe, at
9 the meeting that my vote was based upon the entire record,
10 which included the complaints that were presented, not the
11 ones that weren't presented, the answer that was filed on
12 behalf of your client, and all of the exhibits and the
13 presentations that were made by the various folks that came
14 forward.

15 So my vote is based upon the entire record that was
16 before me. And I feel like the other members of the
17 commission voted based upon that entire record as well. This
18 written document now will reflect our -- our completely
19 accurate ruling based upon that entire record. The fact that
20 a -- a verbal comment wasn't necessarily made during the
21 course of that meeting and, in my mind, does not preclude us
22 from including facts as long as they are supported by the
23 record.

24 MR. HORWITZ: And I appreciate that that is
25 Mr. Chairman's view here. I do want to note an objection to

1 findings that were included in this record that were not made
2 by the commission.

3 MR. MARTIN: That were not articulated verbally?

4 MR. HORWITZ: Correct.

5 MR. MARTIN: Well, you and I just have to agree to
6 disagree at this point. If the findings in this order are
7 supported by the record, then it's my suggestion that we are
8 authorized to approve this order. Ms. Ashworth, do you
9 concur or disagree?

10 MS. ASHWORTH: I concur.

11 MR. MARTIN: Very well.

12 MR. HORWITZ: I just want my objection noted.

13 MR. MARTIN: All right. Very good.

14 All right. So then the question becomes, do any of
15 you have any concerns about the accuracy of the draft that
16 we've received and whether there is a factual basis to
17 support what's contained in the draft?

18 MR. SHARBER: I do not.

19 MS. WILSON: I do not.

20 MR. MARTIN: And I do not either. I've read the
21 entire transcript. I've read the draft. The fact that maybe
22 something wasn't articulated in our meeting on the 27th of
23 July, that's not in our written decision in the chairperson's
24 mind does not preclude our inclusion in our written decision.
25 So based upon what's been presented, do we have a motion to

1 approve the draft of the written decision of City of Franklin
2 Ethics Commission as brought in this matter?

3 MR. SHARBER: So moved.

4 MS. WILSON: Second.

5 MR. MARTIN: All in favor?

6 MR. SHARBER: Aye.

7 MS. WILSON: Aye.

8 MR. MARTIN: And I vote as well in favor of
9 approving it.

10 I don't know of any other business. Ms. Ashworth,
11 do you know of any other business to come before us?

12 MS. ASHWORTH: No, I do not. I think we can get
13 the clean copy, I think that is marked a draft, entered today
14 so that Mr. Horwitz can have his copy today.

15 MR. MARTIN: So if we have the clean copy, we can
16 sign off on that it before leave. Mr. Horwitz, good to see
17 you.

18 MR. HORWITZ: I guess, let me just ask: So the
19 Commission has just made a recommendation, that's paragraph
20 16 here, and this comes back to the first issue that I
21 addressed, the timing of that recommendation?

22 MR. MARTIN: Do what?

23 MR. HORWITZ: I'm on the -- the provision that was
24 just approved titled, "Recommendation", as paragraph 16.

25 MR. MARTIN: Yes.

1 MR. HORWITZ: The timing of that recommendation is
2 not reflected here.

3 MR. MARTIN: We will leave that to the Board. We
4 will leave that to the Board.

5 MR. HORWITZ: I would like to know the timing of
6 this Commission's recommendation to the Board.

7 MR. MARTIN: Our recommendation is clear. When and
8 if the Board acts on our recommendation will be up to the
9 Board of Mayor and Aldermen.

10 MR. HORWITZ: What I am trying to pin down is when
11 the recommendation is made, and what I'm asking is that it
12 not be made until the appellate process is concluded.

13 MR. MARTIN: I understand your request. We are
14 making our recommendation as reflected in this written
15 document. When and if the Board acts on it will be up to the
16 Board okay. Thank you.

17 If there is no further business before the
18 Commission, do I have a motion to adjourn?

19 MR. SHARBER: So moved.

20 MS. WILSON: Second.

21 MR. MARTIN: All in favor?

22 MR. SHARBER: Aye.

23 MS. WILSON: Aye.

24 MR. MARTIN: Same here. If you will record my vote
25 as aye. Mr. Horwitz, good to see you.
